**Dates:** Sunday, March 15th - Wednesday, March 18th

**WHERE:** Forest Glen Camp & Retreat Center

**TRANSPORTATION:** 14forty staff & volunteers will transport students from Eagle Mountain International Church (EMIC) to Forest Glen Camp and return students to EMIC from Forest Glen Camp via charter bus. EMIC will ONLY be responsible for transporting students to and from camp.

**CHECK IN:** Local students must check-in with their luggage at EMIC in the Student Life Center (SLC) on Saturday, March 14<sup>th</sup> from 9:00 am-11:00 am. For students that are coming in from out of town, we will have a special check-in on Sunday, March 15<sup>th</sup> from 8:00 am-9:30 am.

**DROP OFF:** Student drop off time is 8:00-9:30am on Sunday, March 16th. Everyone will be checking in before Main Service, which begins at 10AM. Immediately following the Sunday 10AM Service, we will be loading the buses and departing for Forest Glen. Lunch will be provided for all students after service before loading the buses for camp. Estimated time of arrival to EMIC on Wednesday, March 18th is approximately 5:00pm. Parents will check-out their student and may attend Wednesday night service in the Main Sanctuary as 14Forty will not have a mid-week service March 18th.

## ABOUT:

Philippians 3:10 AMPC says, "[For my determined purpose is] that I may know Him [that I may progressively become more deeply and intimately acquainted with Him, perceiving and recognizing and understanding the wonders of His Person more strongly and more clearly], and that I may in that same way come to know the power outflowing from His resurrection [ which it exerts over believers], and that I may so share His sufferings as to be continually transformed [in spirit into His likeness even] to His death, [in the hope]..."

The 14forty Spring Retreat Theme for 2026 is: KNOWING. After a brief time away to refresh and refocus, our leader, Pastor George Pearsons returned with a relationship renewal, purposely determined to know the Lord on a deeper level. Through Pastor George sharing and teaching on his experience, we have learned and witnessed the victory that comes from this knowing. The word, "Knowing," refers to knowledge, awareness, confidence, and relationship.

This year, we believe God is inviting our students into that same journey. He wants to reveal Himself to them, not just as God, but as their loving Father, their closest Friend, and the One who calls them His own. At spring retreat, we're expecting powerful moments where teens will encounter God, gaining knowledge, increase awareness, grow in confidence, and expand their relationship with Him. Knowing these truths will help them stand victoriously in life.

## STUDENT GUIDELINES:

1. All students are expected to attend/participate in all group events and services.
2. All students are expected to treat authority figures, leaders, volunteers, and Forest Glen staff with honor and respect.
3. Students will refrain from any use of profanity.
4. Firearms, knives, or weapons of any nature are prohibited.
5. Alcohol, drugs, vapes, or any form of tobacco is prohibited.
6. Males are not allowed in the female cabins, and females are not allowed in the male cabins.
7. Students should refrain from personal displays of affection.
8. Male and female students should dress in a modest manner which exhibits Godly character.
9. All students will be expected to be inside their assigned cabins no later than the announced curfew.
10. Physical or verbal altercations will not be tolerated among campers or staff.
11. Persons or groups responsible for destruction of camp property will be accountable for replacement or repair cost of such property. (i.e. No writing on walls, bunks, buildings, trees, or other property.)
12. Pranking is not allowed.
13. The use or possession of fireworks is prohibited by students.

\*Most items left behind/forgotten will only be kept for one week, and then donated to charity.

## WHAT TO BRING:

- Bible & Journal/Notebook
- Bedding & a Pillow (sleeping bags & fitted twin sheet work great!)
- Towel (for showering)
- Toiletries (shampoo, soap, deodorant, toothbrush/toothpaste, etc.)
- Casual Clothes (Clothes you aren't afraid to get dirty! We will be out in the woods, so dress accordingly. Ziplining, rock climbing, canoeing, etc. are just a few of our activities, so make sure you can be active in what you choose to wear.)
  - Flannels, jackets, long sleeves, sweatshirts (it will be chilly!)
  - Comfortable shoes, socks, shower shoes

- Ladies – If you wish to wear leggings, please make sure that your shirt covers your bottom. If it doesn't, you will be asked to change!
- Please ensure all shorts are at least fingertip length.
- For Ropes Courses:
  - Tennis Shoes (sandals are NOT allowed for activities)
  - Appropriate clothing for the course (There may be times when you will be above the others, so be selective in choosing your shorts.)
- Nicer clothes for evening services
- Flashlight
- Insect Repellant
- Money for Camp Store - Optional (Forest Glen store offers snacks, soft drinks, T-shirts, candy, stuffed animals, water bottles, etc.)

**WHAT NOT TO BRING:**

- Fireworks
- Weapons
- Tobacco, Vapes, Alcohol
- Valuables
