When: June 1st – June 5th

Where: Forest Glen - 34 Forest Glen Road - Huntsville, TX 77340

Cost: \$150 (T-Shirt included)

Registration: Opens Sunday, November 17, 2019 (A child is considered "Registered" when all the forms are submitted along with a deposit of \$50.)

- Registration closes Thursday, May 14, 2020
- The final payment is due by Saturday, May 30, 2020

Age Requirements: 1st – 5th Grade

Transportation: Superkid Academy will transport campers from Eagle Mountain International Church (EMIC) to Forest Glen Camp and return campers to EMIC from Forest Glen Camp via charter bus. Parents will not travel with campers per policy.

Drop off Information: Campers must check-in at EMIC in the Student Life Center (SLC) on Monday, June 1, 2020 at 7:00AM.

Pick Up Information: Campers must be picked up and checked out with their Sr. Counselor on Friday, June 5, 2020 at EMIC in the SLC. An estimated arrival time will be communicated at check-in on June 1st, but we will be sending out updated arrival times on social media the day of.

COMMON QUESTIONS:

- Who is on staff during camp?
 - EMIC SKA Staff, and EMIC Volunteers.
 - Forest Glen Staff will run the activities, but EMIC counselors will always be with the children assigned to them.
- Are campers always supervised?
 - Yes, counselors are with campers 24 hours a day.
- How are the campers disciplined?
 - First time- warning, Second time- sit out an activity, Third time- sent to Commanders Blake or Kelsey. Continued disobedience could result in a call home or even dismissal from camp.
- May I call my camper?
 - We are fully aware of our great responsibility in the care of your child. In case of an emergency, you will be notified immediately. Out of consideration for other campers and planned activities, incoming calls are not allowed except in case of an emergency.
- Can I reach someone at camp any time in case of an emergency?
 - Yes, this emergency number will be handed out at a later date.
- What do you do for homesick campers?
 - Homesick campers may call home, however campers who become homesick and leave camp early are not eligible for refunds. If a camper leaves camp for any reason, it is the responsibility of the parents to provide transportation home.
- Is a nurse available at all times?
 - Yes.
- Do you give kids pain reliever if needed?
 - Yes, designated EMIC staff is available at the nurses station to dispense over the counter medication.
- Does my child need to turn in his medicine even if he knows when to take it and how much?
 - Yes, designated medical staff will ensure medications are taken care of.
- Are feminine products available at camp?
 - Yes.
- Are you able to provide special dietary needs?
 - Yes, the camp can accommodate gluten free, dairy free, and vegetarian. After your child is registered, you will receive an email from Forest Glen to coordinate your child's dietary needs.

- Are washing machines available for campers that wet the bed?
 - Yes, our team will ensure to take care of these situations in a discreet manner.
- How many times a day do you have chapel services?
 - Two: one in the morning, one in the evening.
- What specific activities will the campers be doing?
 - Arts & Crafts, Basketball, Dance, Drama, Fishing, Football, Kickball, Soccer, Swimming, Tech
- What are Electives?
 - Electives are training sessions where your child gets to learn something new or fine tune their skills. During the registration process your child will get to rank Electives in order of interest.

PACKING LIST: LUGGAGE IS LIMITED TO ONE (1) SUITCASE, ONE (1) BACKPACK AND BEDDING

What to Bring: PLEASE PUT YOUR CHILD'S NAME ON EVERYTHING THEY BRING TO CAMP

- Bible & Journal/Notebook
- Casual clothes (clothes they can get dirty in and clean clothes for service)
- Modest shorts
- Light jacket and a hat/cap
- Modest swimming suit (one-piece for girls)
- Tennis shoes and water shoes/old shoes for the lake
- Twin sheets and/or sleeping bag
- Pillow
- Towels and washcloth
- Toiletries: soap, shampoo, toothbrush, toothpaste, deodorant, etc.
- Hairbrush, comb, etc.
- Laundry bag for dirty clothes
- Sunscreen
- Flashlight
- Camera
- Prescription medication (will be turned in during the check-in process)

Do NOT Bring: CAMPERS BRINGING THESE ITEMS MAY BE SENT HOME OR THE ITEM MAY BE CONFISCATED

- Cellphones
- Electronic games
- Over the counter medication
- Radios, CD or MP3 Players
- Prank or gag materials
- Clothing with vulgar or suggestive slogans

- Comics or magazines
- Water guns or water balloons
- Knives of any kind
- Fireworks or firearms of any kind
- Tobacco, drugs or alcohol
- Valuables

DISCIPLINE POLICY:

At camp we will follow a 3-strike policy. The counselors will be in charge of the children and all their instructions are to keep your child safe and make sure that every camper gets to have fun and encounter God at camp. Bullying and destruction of camp or EMIC property is taken very seriously and could lead to an immediate meeting with Commanders Blake or Kelsey.

- Strike 1: This is a warning. If a child is disobedient they will be given a verbal warning.
- Strike 2: This is what we will call getting “Benched”. If a child continues to be disrespectful or disobedient, they will have to sit out their next activity.
- Strike 3: On the 3rd offence the child will have to talk to Commanders Blake or Kelsey.
- If the behavior issues are not resolved after these steps have been taken, we will contact the parent/guardian to come pick up their child.

MEDICATION POLICY:

- Prescription medications need to be in the original bottle, with only the amount needed for the campers stay at camp.
- All inhalers, nasal spray, and EpiPen’s must be in the prescription box with label and must NOT be expired.
- All prescription bottles should come in a Ziploc bag with a completed Medication Form.
- All medications will be kept in the Nurses Station.

LOST & FOUND:

- All luggage will receive a luggage tag at Sunday check in.
- The best way to prevent lost items is to have all your campers clothing and belongings marked.
- Any items left behind will be held at SKA for a short time past camp.
